2. Data Review

A. Pedestrian and Bicycle Master Plan (City of Maize)

Jolene Graham, Deputy City Administrator, presented Maize's Pedestrian and Bicycle Plan (<u>City of Maize in Motion</u>). This plan was a result of the 2017 Planning Walkable Places grant, which used unobligated WAMPO funding. They focused in creating a planning study with high level of community input, which led them to identify priorities in their communities like safe routes to parks and schools, off street or buffered on street bike lanes and identify missing links within communities. Richard LaMunyon, City Administrator, invited communities to collaborate and work together in the development of these plans.


B. Existing and Future Trails in the WAMPO Region

Mr. Parasa opened up the conversation about existing trail systems both off-the road and on-the-road bikeways.
